Apple Oobleck

Apple Oobleck

Ingredients: 1 part water 2 parts cornstarch Food colouring (red) Cinnamon, nutmeg, cloves

Before & After School Care Program Update _{By Abi Asaytuno}

Due to the operational and staffing costs incurred when a parent/guardian is late, a late fee will be charged and the emergency contact person may be called to pick up the child(ren). When a child is not picked up at the agreed upon time, a late fee will be applied. If the child(ren) are picked up late repeatedly (more than twice), the Before & After School Care Program Supervisor will ask the parents to find alternative pick-up or child care arrangements. Upon the third disregard of school policies, a letter will be sent home to cancel their Before & After School Care Program agreement.

- The parent/guardian will be charged a rate per minute past the agreed upon time.
- Each time a parent/guardian is late, an increased rate per minute will apply.
- First late fee applied will be \$1 per minute. The fee for the second time late is \$2 per minute and so forth.
- Any time late after that, in a 30 calendar day period, the rate will be \$3 per minute.
- Should you arrive after the school is closed 2 or more times, you will no longer be eligible for the Before & After School Care Program service.
- If late 5 times in any seven-week period, the family faces removal from the school.
