

Wait and Watch how they are interacting with the world around them before joining your child in play. Wonder about what they are doing. What is bringing them joy? What about doing this is bringing them pleasure? Is it the visual input? Does it remind them of something they love? Think about how you can join this interaction with them.

Now that you have waited, watched and wondered.- join them! Join them in this interaction that is meaningful to them. Joining them will look different for each child. This might look like joining them running around or listening to them talk about their favourite movie/toy/game. Be curious about what they are doing. You might use facial and body affect (e.g., big gasps, widening the eyes, pointing to what they are looking at). You can use wonderment such as, "I am wondering about...". Don't feel pressured to be doing more. Allow yourself to just join them in what is meaningful for them.

We hope you join us, the Parent Support Team, this year too as we continue to embrace the DIR Floortime® model during bi-monthy parent support groups, workshops, monthly contests and so much more!

We are so excited to welcome new and returning students back to another safe and exciting school year! Here are a few health and safety reminders for Oakwood Families:

- Screening forms must be sent to <u>HS@oakwoodacademy.ca</u> by 8am each morning.
- If your child does not pass screening, a Back to School Form must be filled out and submitted to HS@oakwoodacademy.ca before your child returns to school.
- Our screening form, Back to School Form, and Health and Safety Policies and Procedures Manual can be found on our website: www.oakwoodacademy.ca/covid19-policy-forms/
- Please arrive during your child's scheduled cohort time and maintain 6ft distance from other families. We ask that students who are able to, and parents/guardians wear masks during drop off and pick up times in order to maintain safety.


Here's what Oakwood is doing to help keep our community safe

- Staff and faculty members must also submit a screening form to <u>HS@oakwoodacademy.ca</u> each morning by 7am.
- Oakwood Academy has implemented an Immunization Disclosure Policy and Mandatory Testing Policy for staff and faculty, as per guidelines from the Ministry of Education. Staff and Faculty members must disclose their vaccination status, and there is frequent, mandatory testing for partially vaccinated and unvaccinated staff and faculty members
- Staff and faculty members always have access to appropriate PPE while working with students (i.e., medical masks, eye protection). Gloves and gowns are available and recommended for specific situations such as assisting with toileting and feeding.
- Temperature checks will be conducted and recorded for staff, faculty members, and students upon arrival, and again during mid-day. Classroom contact tracing sheets are also filled out daily in order to track movement through the building.
- Sanitizers and cleaning supplies are readily available to ensure a safe and healthy learning environment.
- We are regularly reviewing health and safety information released from Peel Public Health and the government of Ontario, and will provide updates to staff and families when necessary.

Here's what else you can do to help keep our community safe

- Although our Immunization Disclosure Policy only applies to staff and faculty members, families are welcome to
 disclose their child's vaccination status. This information is completely **optional**, and will only be used for the
 purpose of assisting Peel Public Health.
- Students who are 12 years old and over are eligible to receive the Pfizer vaccine. Clinical studies have shown that
 the vaccine is safe and effective. For more information, please visit
